



## Performing a Clean Uninstall in Windows 98 SE/ME

Under some troubleshooting or update circumstances, users may wish to reproduce a “fresh installation” condition on a particular PC. In other words, you might want the computer to be in the state it was in before the US-224 was installed for the first time.

If you want to perform a fresh reinstall, here's how to uninstall all references to the US-224 in the computer. *NOTE:* Depending on the driver version installed on the PC in question, not all files listed in this document may appear in your installation.

A. Delete any of the following files that may appear in C:\WINDOWS\SYSTEM32\DRIVERS:

- US224DL.SYS
- US224.SYS
- US224WDM.SYS

B. Delete the following files (if they exist) from C:\WINDOWS\INF:

- US224.INF
- US224.PNF
- DRVDATA.BIN
- DRVIDX.BIN

C. Delete the following file from C:\WINDOWS\INF\OTHER:

- TASCAMUS224.INF

D. Delete the following files (if they exist) from c:\windows\system:

- US224cp.cpl
- U224\_A16.dll
- U224\_A24.dll

E. In Device Manager, find any copies of “TASCAM US-224” and “US-224 WDM Interface” in “Sound, Video, and Game Controllers” and click “Remove” for each (and don't reboot yet).

- E. Run the Registry Edit (START/RUN, type REGEDIT).  
Under the key HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\ENUM\USB, delete the entries
- HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\ENUM\USB\VID\_1604&PID\_8002
  - HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\ENUM\USB\VID\_1604&PID\_8003
  - HKEY\_LOCAL\_MACHINE\ENUM\US224

(Note that you may not have all these files, depending on which version of the US-224 drivers you are uninstalling.)

The next time Windows sees a US-224 it will run the New Hardware Wizard.
